How about being a sanctuary for God? Have you ever considered that possibility before? Does that idea scare you? Excite you? Why do you feel that way?

What things do you need to do to continue to be a sanctuary? Can you commit to doing those things? If you are unsure, take your concerns and hesitation to God. Ask for the wisdom and courage to make that commitment.
